One hundred years ago, by founding their own public organisation, the Livonians assured themselves and the then newly established Latvian state that they were ready to protect their language and stand up for their Livonian roots. And today, a hundred years later, the Livonian tradition is alive on the Livonian coast, because there are Livonians!

This year Latvia and the Livonian community suffered a painful loss – the soul of the Awakening, the preserver of Livonian traditions and public worker Helmī Stalte passed away. We will remember her today and in the future.

Despite the fact that many of the world's languages have already disappeared, today people still sing in Livonian, write in Livonian and learn Livonian. Therefore, it is the duty of the Latvian state to preserve the Livonian language and cultural heritage,' said President Edgars Rinkēvičs during a meeting with representatives of the Livonian community.
